



Carriers made out of a hard plastic provide the most stability and safety for your pet.



Avoid designs that are held together by screws as these can rust, making the screws very difficult to remove, and those that only have on the end/side zippers as these are more difficult to get the cat out of.



Carriers that have a removable lid held together with snap tabs and/or open from the top with a zipper or door are **best**. This makes getting your cat in and out of the carrier a lot easier which puts much less stress on kitty.



Be sure to make sure your cat has enough room to stand and turn around inside the carrier. Once kitty reaches his/her adult weight monitor the fit and get a bigger one if needed.







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
